



Contract Management: Not Following Procedures Undermines Best Pricing Under Gsas Schedule: Gao-01-125

The Department of Defense (DOD) spends millions of dollars each year to acquire information technology (IT) services through the General Services Administrations (GSA) Federal Supply Schedule (FSS). However, DOD has not been taking steps critical to ensuring that it gets the best services at the best prices. GAOs review of 22 DOD orders revealed that 17 of them were placed without seeking competitive quotes. GSAs established procedures require that agencies seek competitive quotes to ensure that the government gets the best price for IT services. Many DOD contracting officers were unaware of this requirement and placed orders under FSS contracts without seeking quotes from multiple contractors. The Federal Acquisition Regulation covering FSS contracts does not provide clear guidance to contracting officers on these special ordering procedures. This item ships from La Vergne, TN. Paperback.

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
